## **Executive Summary**

Kingston Hospital NHS Foundation Trust participates in the National Programme for organ donation. This paper describes the activity related to organ donation over the previous year 1 April 2014 – 31 March 2015. The details are included in the accompanying report from the National Blood and Transplant Authority.

The Trust has in place the required Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SN-OD) and a Trust Lead Clinician, Dr Mhadi Al Sahaf consultant Anaesthetist and Intensivist. The coordination and identification of potential donors along with the required reporting is coordinated through these individuals. The Organ Donation Committee meets quarterly.

Although the numbers of patients considered potential and actual donors are small the Trust is identifying and referring patients as appropriate. Comparisons with national best practice are included in the full report. Two deceased patients donated organs received by 4 patients in this period.

The Chair of the Organ Donation Committee retired this year, the new chair will be appointed imminently. The Committee meets 3 times a year.

Organ donation in the Trust was the subject of an Internal Audit in 2015. An action plan was developed to address the recommendations from the report and progress on the action plan will be reported to the Audit Committee.
